Dear Premier,

CPCI and our Saskatchewan members want to applaud you and your government for demonstrating solid leadership during this unprecedented health and economic crisis. The precast concrete industry is committed to assisting the government in any way possible to ensure that our province's workers and residents are safe, our businesses return to profitability, and Saskatchewan's economy recovers quickly.

We want to thank the government for recognizing construction as an essential service. A large part of our economic recovery from this crisis will be focused on the construction sector as an important driver of the overall economy. In addition to the 3 plants in Saskatchewan that are certified by the Canadian Precast Concrete Quality Assurance (CPCQA) Certification Program, our industry is also allied with many cement manufacturing facilities across Canada and 55 ready-mix concrete facilities in Saskatchewan, many of which are small to medium sized businesses. As an industry we feel it is critical to stay the course with existing infrastructure investments and to work with the province and municipalities to advance projects that can begin construction as soon as the health crisis subsides. With the retraction of consumer confidence and spending, the economy will have to rely more on public construction (shovels in the ground projects) to pull us out of this recession.
